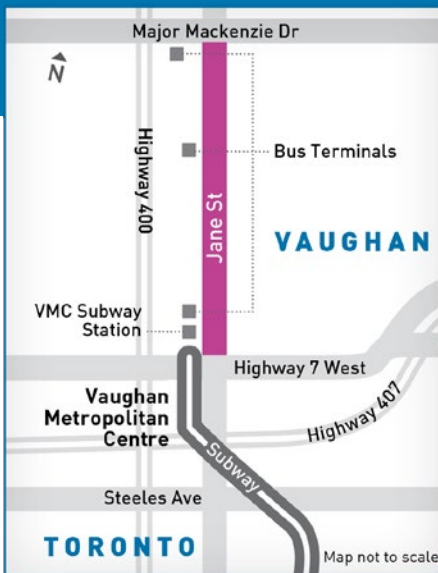


Bus Rapid Transit project: Jane Street

connections

- » Vaughan is one three employment megazones in the GTHA – BRT along Jane Street will support housing and job growth, reduce traffic congestion and connect people to jobs and destinations.
- » Jane Street BRT will connect to key destinations for healthcare, shopping and entertainment, and to transportation routes, including subway, BRT on Highway 7, and YRT buses at 3 bus terminals.
- » Jane Street bus routes currently service 12,000 daily passenger trips and are projected to service over 20,500 daily passenger trips by 2035.

project status

- » Jane Street BRT is in the early stages of project planning and design, with work on the Environmental Assessment beginning in January 2025. This work will take approximately 18–24 months to complete.
- » Funding from senior levels of government is needed to start construction on this critical bus rapid transit corridor.

location and length

- » The planned Jane Street Bus Rapid Transit [BRT] project in Vaughan will be approximately 6.3 kilometres between Highway 7 and Major Mackenzie Drive.
